The Challenge

Confusion

- Issues regarding what the exact product was
- The project was referred to as either "USCG Basic and Advanced Emergency Ship Handling Training" or "Basic and Advanced Ship Handling"
- There is no "USCG Basic and Advanced Emergency Ship Handling Training" recognized or required by IMO or USCG





The Solution

- Three possible choices
 - Cancel the project
 - Develop Emergency Ship Handling courses that would not be USCG approved or meet IMO training guidelines
 - Develop Ship Handling courses that would be USCG approved and meet IMO training guidelines





Deliverable A

- Task
 - Develop two original USCG Approved Basic Shiphandling and Advanced Shiphandling courses
- Work Product
 - Completed Course Syllabus
- Work Started: 1 July 2021
- Work Completed: 15 October 2021





Deliverable B

Task

 Develop simulation-based assessments and a written final exam for students to demonstrate successful completion

Work Product

- Completed simulation based assessment for both courses and a written exam for the Basic Shiphandling Course
- Due to the nature and topics of the Advanced Shiphandling Course it was determined that simulation based assessments alone were the most effective assessment instrument to be used to demonstrate successful completion
- Work Started: 18 October 2021
- Work Completed: 25 January 2022





Deliverable C

- Task
 - Design courses to meet USCG and IMO requirement and submit to USCG for approval
- Work Product
 - Application to the USCG for course approval
- Work Started: 4 January 2022
- Work Completed: 31 January 2022





Deliverable D

- Task
 - Preparation of final written report, including an executive summary and virtual (or in person) presentation in Power Point format to the Council Board of Directors at an agreed upon meeting time
- Work Product
 - Final Report and Presentation
- Work Started: October 2021
- Work Completed: May 2022





Final Course Approval

- We received notification from the Coast Guard on April 26, 2022 that the Basic Shiphandling course is approved.
- Basic Shiphandling has been put on our training schedule to be offered this fall term.
- We received notification from the Coast Guard on April 28, 2022 that the Advanced Shiphandling course is approved and it will be placed on our training schedule as well.






Alaska Focus
