## Prince William Sound RCAC recertification application for public review

The Prince William Sound Regional Citizens' Advisory Council is seeking recertification as the alternative voluntary advisory group for Prince William Sound, as authorized under the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA 90). The application has been <u>submitted to the U.S. Coast Guard</u>, which is charged with assessing whether the council fosters the general goals and purposes of OPA 90 and is broadly representative of communities and interests as envisioned under OPA 90.
